From Death to


Resulvection Isaiah 53:4-6

4 "Surely, He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

Roughly 2000 years ago, an amazing event took place in a city named Jerusalem. A man named Jesus defeated death as He resurrected from an earthly grave. A grave that was guarded and sealed. A grave that would have held any ordinary man. Jesus was no ordinary man. He was, and is, the Son of God.

The resurrection of Jesus was an amazing event and one that is rightly celebrated by Christians today. We should feel extreme joy when we consider the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In that moment, death, hell and our enemy, satan, were all defeated. God's plan for redeeming each one of us was in place. The free gift of salvation and an opportunity for eternal life with Jesus' victory over death, was now ours. Life for the human race would never ever be the same.

As amazing as the resurrection is, it relied on another event to take place first. That event was the suffering and death, by crucifixion, of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Without death, there is no resurrection. Without the pain, the suffering, the agony, the loneliness and the humiliation, there is no resurrection. Today we memorialize, discuss and admire the life of Jesus. We celebrate His birth and resurrection. Yet maybe the single most important aspect of his life, was His death. When Jesus died, He died an innocent, blameless man. In centuries past, many have died deserving to lose their lives. Many have died with regrets, burdens and unpaid debts. I believe that we can safely say that in the history of the world, not



one other person has died blameless and sinless. Jesus did. He walked to the cross perfect, blameless and right. When He surrendered to the cross, something changed. Isaiah 53:6 says that God placed on Jesus all our iniquities. It was for our guilt, our shame, our sins, our wrongs that Jesus died. Satan wanted Jesus to die. Sin, guilt, shame, and wrong should destroy us. Satan said take their guilt and their shame and die. He thought the death of Jesus would be the end. What he did not understand, is that for resurrection to occur, death needed to happen first. With resurrection comes new life. The debt is paid. In the resurrection lies our redemption and new life. Death=redemption and new life. In John 13:34, Jesus instructs us to love like He loves. How do you and I do that in real life? Jesus walked to a cross, laid down and gave His life for you and I. That is how He loves. Can we do the same? We do not have the ability to forgive sins, but we can forgive people. We cannot resurrect from the dead, but we can die to ourselves and resurrect in Christ. I know that sounds kind of scarry. We don't really want to die. Yet Jesus said "love like I do." And then He died. What if you and I, by dying, would create new life? What if our death would help bring resurrection and redemption? Can we walk to our cross and give ourselves up, even though we are right, accepting the wrongs of someone else? Jesus did, and He asked us to do the same. Jesus has never asked us to do bad things, so this must be a good thing. Dying for someone else, must be the right thing to do.

We want to do the right thing. We are, after all, followers of Christ.


